

Pretty Little Pots

By Wendy Williams 49. Patience's Pot

Finished size: 4 1/4" x 6 1/4"





Requirements:

Background fabric: 6" x 7 1/4"

Wool: 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" pumpkin, 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" dark orange, 3" x 2" medium green

Flower motif: 3" x 3"

80 weight thread (or similar): neutral.

Batting: 2 1/2" x 2"

Cotton for pot: 3 1/2" x 3"

Freezer paper

Cutting:

- Cut out the background fabric 5 ¼" x 7 ¼"
 The block will be trimmed when finished to 4 ¾" x 6 ¾"
- 2. Cut out the pot (S) in cardboard and batting
- 3. Cut out the fabric for the pot allowing approx. 1/2" seam allowance around all edges.
- 4. Cut out the 2 wool circles using the template sheet as a guide for size. Cut out the leaves.
- 5. Cut out the flower motif larger than the 'hole' in the centre of the smallest circle.

Making: Little Pot

As before


- 1. Place the batting onto the cardboard pot shape.
- 2. Place the fabric over the batting and glue to the underside of the cardboard. Try to fold the fabric over as tight as possible.
- 3. Press the fabric from the right side and then again from the underside. Allow to cool and then carefully remove the cardboard. (a cuticle stick is helpful for this)
- 4. Using the template as a guide for placement, pin the pot into position.
- 5. Stitch with small slip stitches to attach the pot to the background.

Flower, stem and leaves:

- 1. Cut a 'hole' in the centre of the smaller circle large enough for the flower motif to show through. (reverse applique).
- 2. Pin the 2 circles together with the fabric between the 2 layers. Stitch with a row of whipstitch in large and small stitches. Add some colonial knots at the ends of the whipstitch in a contrasting colour.
- 3. Stitch the flower to the background with a round of running backstitch.
- 4. Chalk on the line of the stem. Stitch with a row of stem stitch.
- 5. Pin the leaves to the background and stitch with a row of backstitch around the outer edge. Add a row of zig zag in the centre.


