

# **Pretty Little Pots**

51. Palani's Pot

Finished size: 4 1/4" x 6 3/4"





## Requirements:

Background fabric: 6" x 8"

Wool:  $3'' \times 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " steel,  $2'' \times 2''$  lipstick,  $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x  $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " dark orange

80 weight thread (or similar): neutral.

Batting: 2 ½" x 3"
Cotton for pot: 4" x 3"

Freezer paper

## **Cutting:**

- 1. Cut out the background fabric 5  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 7  $\frac{3}{4}$ "

  The block will be trimmed when finished to 4  $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 7  $\frac{1}{4}$ "
- 2. Cut out the pot (R) in cardboard and batting
- 3. Cut out the fabric for the pot allowing approx. 1/2" seam allowance around all edges.
- 4. Cut out the 3 wool circles using the template sheet as a guide for size.

## **Making: Little Pot**

#### As before


- 1. Place the batting onto the cardboard pot shape.
- 2. Place the fabric over the batting and glue to the underside of the cardboard. Try to fold the fabric over as tight as possible.
- 3. Press the fabric from the right side and then again from the underside. Allow to cool and then carefully remove the cardboard. (a cuticle stick is helpful for this)
- 4. Using the template as a guide for placement, pin the pot into position.
- 5. Stitch with small slip stitches to attach the pot to the background.

## Flower, stem and leaf:

- 1. Cut a 'hole' in the centre of the smaller circle.
- 2. Pin and stitch the 2 smaller circles together with whip stitch. Add some colonial knots between the stitches on the outer edge and in the centre.
- 3. Stitch the centre circles to the larger circle with a round of zig zag stitches. Add some colonial knots around the outer edge.
- 4. Stitch the flower to the background with a round of running backstitch.
- 5. Chalk on the line of the stem. Stitch with a row of chain stitch.
- 6. Chalk on the outline for the leaf. Stitch the outline with arrow of stem stitch. Note that you will need to stop and start again on the corners.
- 7. Stitch a row of backstitch through the centre of the leaf. Fill the space with cross stitch and colonial knots.


Note- the lines are shown to indicate the correct size as a guide for printing.











Zig zag (glove) Stitch:

Colonial knot:




